

#### **Our Mission**

## From the Camps

As many of you know, the last year has been one of pretty significant transitions for our family. We went from Children's Ministry to full-time support raising for the mission in Nicaragua to serving in Youth Ministry here at Pinewoods. Shortly after that the door



I wanted to share with you some of what we have been learning, both about Colombia and our team, but also how the Lord always seems to operate outside of our expectations and limitations.

We visited several areas in and around the city of Medellin during our site trip in May. The sights, sounds, and overall atmosphere (read: weather) there are stunning. In fact, next time you buy flowers, check out the label... Chances are they came from Medellin, also known as "la ciudad de la eterna primavera," or "The City of Eternal Spring."

While there, we had the opportunity to see some of the campuses where our teammate, John (of the McCall family), will bring discipleship to college students through outdoor ministry. We met with national pastors and partners at a local seminary where our Team Leader and Regional Director, Nate (of the Bonham family), was providing training on expanding the vision for discipleship to the next generation of Colombians for the sake of Christ. And our family (the Camps!) were greeted by both the national and international pastors and leaders with so much hope and excitement in the prospect of our arrival. We even got to visit some of the national parks where Kiera and Oakley played and experienced what life and ministry could look like from their perspective. All in all, we had a great time and learned as much as we could about the place, the people, the opportunities, and most importantly, the need for the Gospel.

As of today, it is estimated that 94.1% of Colombia is considered "reached" (The Joshua Project). The problem with these numbers, however, is that of this (uniquely) high rate of Christianity, only the tiniest percentage (approximately 3%) has a working knowledge of God's grace found in Christ alone. This means that there is a major presence of "Christianity" throughout the country, but hardly any presence of the Gospel! We also learned that many of the pastors who serve (and they do faithfully serve) their congregations have had little-to-no training or education from

Scripture or theology, which produces more people who have yet to experience the freedom and joy of knowing and being known by God through the death and resurrection of Jesus. This is a tragedy – but it is also the best opportunity!

Ashley and I have the great desire to see the Gospel take root in the lives of the people of Colombia, throughout Latin America, and to the ends of the earth. We have witnessed the power of the Gospel – in our own family, in our church, and in the lives of those we love – and we are convinced that the only way people, cultures, and nations ever really change is through the Gospel: the very power of God to save (Rom. 1:16). To that end, my vision is to bring theological education to pastors and lay-leaders in Medellin, with the prayerful goal of seeing new churches planted in and around the city with our team. Ashley will bring her love of people and passion for listening well to provide healing through Gospel-centered counseling and training for others to do the same in the context of the local church (Eph. 4:12).

For our vision to materialize, we need you. First, we need your dedicated prayer. I will include specific requests below that capture what our family needs and how you can pray for us regularly. But beware: when Jesus called his disciples to pray for missionaries, he turned around and sent all of them (Matt. 9:38-10:1)!

This brings me to my next point: we need your monthly financial support! Did you know that the Apostle John wrote, "We ought to support such people like these, that we may be fellow workers for the truth" (3 John 1:8)? This is such a joy and encouragement to us because it means that according to the Holy Spirit, through your support, you are even more than senders – you are in a real, tangible way "going" with us to Colombia!

Our goal is to be able to attend the last cross-cultural training that MTW has for us in Belgium in January – which means we need to raise over 80% of our total monthly need by December 1<sup>st</sup>. We are rejoicing to be at 26% already today! Would you consider joining us? Unless you beat us to it, if we haven't met with you yet, we will be reaching out to you over the course of the next few weeks to talk to you more about God's mission in Colombia and your role in it.

Finally, a word to our current supporters: The Lord has provided abundantly for our family and for his mission – and he has used you to do so. We wanted to say "thank you" to every single one of you who has given, provided a meal, and prayed with and for us when we haven't felt like praying (yes, those times have come). "Thank you" truly does not feel like enough, but I am reminded of Jesus' words to those who give abundantly as you have: "Your Father who sees in secret will reward you" (Matt. 6:4). That is better than any word of thanks we can give, but please know that we are so grateful for all of you and the love that you have shown our family.

It has not been an easy year, but it has been a good one, where we have witnessed the Lord recalibrating our family; providing for us; reminding us of his calling on our lives to see his kingdom advanced wherever he sends us; and ultimately showing us that wherever we go, he is with us, he is faithful, and all authority belongs to him (Matt. 28:18). This is truly good news!

On June 30, the first baptisms were performed in Christ Our Refuge Church. The woman who is second from the right in the baptism photo below is Patience. Though Patience grew up in church, she said that she had never clearly heard and understood the gospel until she began coming to COR. The experience that she has had in different churches since being an adult is sadly true of many Ugandans – hearing various expressions of the prosperity/miracle gospel. But Ben and Kim thank God for directing Patience to us and for working faith in her through the power of the gospel. To date the church has baptized 7 adults and 14 children.

After conducting membership classes and interviewing those who went through them, the church has welcomed 35 new adult members and 26 children! The Lord has been so faithful to give these members new understanding about biblical church membership, and then to grant them ability to commit themselves to COR. The leadership team began praying early this year for the Lord to add 40 members by the end of 2019 – and it's very possible He might give us exactly that!

One of the new members is Rogers. Someone recently asked Rogers why he decided to join COR. He told them that in Kampala, most people view church as a place you go in order to get a benefit or blessing – whether it be spiritual, financial, emotional, or other. And so you have many people going, especially to large churches with well-known pastors, because it seems as if people are somehow benefitting from being there. He said that he has learned from being at COR that church is actually supposed to be a committed community of people who are called to serve each other in love. And that is exactly the opportunity he has at COR. Wow, what a testimony!

#### NEWS FROM KIM REGARDING THE RECENT BOOK DRIVE:

We want to report on the request that we made for Children's books back in June -- Many individuals and several churches responded, and we received over 100 books! Kim filled 3 50-pound bags to fly back with to Uganda. Thank you so much to those who sent books and a blue-tooth speaker for serving the children of COR in this way! 

Evan reports that they have officially entered into the raining season here in their country of ministry, and the weather now resembles that of a tropical rain forest. Charlotte and Lucas have loved playing in the rain. These next few weeks should be the peak of raining season before they go another 9 months without seeing any rain. Bonnie and Evan have also been enjoying this time of cooler wet weather.

The ministry is going well. Evan has had a busy month, mostly with children's ministry activities. Schools began their summer vacations at the beginning of July, which means the local children have had much more free time. This has opened up many more evangelistic opportunities for Evan and Bonnie.

While teaching at the school, Evan has been working alongside a local pastor who gave Evan the opportunity to participate in a vacation bible school. It was a three-day camp, with over 100 kids in attendance. Since a good portion of the kids were of a non-Christian faith and had little to no understanding of the bible, Evan focused on reinforcing the basics of the Bible: that we are sinners, redeemed by the death of Jesus. Overall it was a great experience, and Evan looks forward to continuing teaching many of those same kids once a week when school starts back.

The ministry also held a soccer tournament for the children in the neighborhood. A few of the kids from the neighborhood have started attending church, and overall the tournament was a great opportunity for outreach. Approximately sixty kids competed and most of these kids attend other ministry programs offered by the church. Evan gave out t-shirts to all the kids with the name of the church on them. After the tournament all the kids came back to the church and had a brief Bible study, and a trophy was awarded to the winner of the tournament. It was fun to see how excited the children got. Overall, it provided great exposure for the church, especially since many other people in the village came to watch.



## LIBRAY NEWS - A FINE BOOK REVIEW BY MATT SCHELLING

## The Green Ember Series by S.D. Smith

The world is enchanted, and a good story helps to unlock that wonder. In *Orthodoxy*, G.K. Chesterton wrote: "These tales say that apples were golden only to refresh the forgotten moment when we found that they were green. They make rivers run with wine only to make us remember, for one wild moment, that they run with water." Author S.D. Smith believes in a redeemed imagination and in nurturing that imagination. In fact, he believes that faith and imagination are intertwined: "We need muscles to lift heavier things as we grow—muscles of faith to see what's true but not yet present. We're commanded to seek first the kingdom of God, and we need faith to glimpse it. Imagination is seeing what's not present."


In 2014 S.D. Smith wrote his first book, *The Green Ember*, and used an innovative means to get it published. Taking to the relatively new crowdshare app called Kickstarter, he raised money through donations to pay for the first printing. At the time he had no idea of how this book and future installments would connect with his readers. Since then he has published five more books and become recognizable, not just in America, but worldwide. The question becomes, how does a series about fictional rabbits, or "rabbits with swords" to be more specific, resonate so deeply?

The first chapter of his first novel *The Green Ember* introduces us to an idyllic setting, where siblings Heather and Pickett are playing in the beautiful fields of their peaceful home. That serenity is suddenly broken when wolves descend on their home and kidnap (and possibly kill) their parents and baby brother. Heather and Pickett narrowly escape and are propelled into adventure and intrigue. They discover that the world of Natalia is filled with both allies and enemies, and some of those enemies might even be their closest friends and family. They learn of a betrayed king and become part of the effort to restore the rightful heir to the throne. They look forward to the day of the Mended Wood, when all will be made right again. But Natalia is not a safe world, and S.D. does not flinch at depicting the sinful actions of his characters. Throughout the series we find cowardice, betrayal, and even murder, but it is in that context that we also find bravery, loyalty, kindness, and love.

We follow Heather and Pickett through three books of the main Green Ember series and learn more about some of the other characters in three shorter stories. While aimed at middle-school children, the series presents truths in such imaginative ways that even adults will find themselves setting down the book to ponder over the passages.

S.D. (or Sam, as I know him) has been a friend of mine for almost thirty years. Even as a young teenager he had an active imagination and I, with a more practical outlook, occasionally tried to temper it. I'm glad he didn't always listen to me. I've admired the way that he left a "normal" job and set out in faith to use the gifts that God gave him. Throughout his success and rise to modest fame he has remained humble and concerned only with giving Jesus the glory. And I say this as an English Lit major, not just as a friend: his books are good.


