From the desk of Senior Pastor Joel Treick



How well do you know the people who sit next to you every Sunday morning? We say hello, we shake hands and smile during the greeting time, but do we really know each other? What if I told you that the person next to you used to be a missionary? What if I told you that the person sitting next to you has an adoption story? What if I told you that the person next to you is a recovering alcoholic? What if I told you that the person sitting next to you is a recovering legalist?

These questions have been on my mind lately as I've been thinking about the church and our community of faith. I want us to grow in our love and appreciation for each other. I want us to hear each other's gospel stories. I want us to know each other ... and find the glorious freedom of being known ... warts and all!

How do we do that? I think we do that one story at a time. So, with that in mind, I've decided to turn my monthly column over to you! In 2018, I'll be doing a series of interviews with members of our congregation. By the end of the year, I think we'll know each other a lot better. But I also think we'll know Jesus a lot better too, as we see his "grace of many colors" in the lives of his people.

We begin this month with our Youth Director, Samuel Armstrong. Samuel came to us in 2015 from First Presbyterian Church in Meridian, Mississippi. Since that time, he's been discipling, teaching, and investing in the lives of our Jr. High and High School students. How well do you know Samuel? Read on and see for yourself ...

Pastor Joel: Samuel ... Tell us a little bit about how you became a Christian. Did you grow up in a Christian home? Did you attend Christian churches when you grew up? Did you have a gradual conversion, or did you have a dramatic, "Saul on the Road to Damascus" type of conversion?

Samuel: I grew up in a Christian home and my parents became missionaries with YWAM Jamaica when I was 5. We came back to the States when I was 8 and lived in Ocala, Florida for most of my childhood. Growing up we went to many churches, but most of our time was spent at non-denominational and Pentecostal-type churches. I always considered myself a Christian, but I really didn't become a Christian until college where my sin became real to me, and the gospel changed my life. My conversion changed who I was overnight, so I would say it was a process of regeneration by the Holy Spirit and life changing when the seeds that so many people in the church planted in me came to life.

PJ: What role, if any, did youth ministry play in your Christian story?

Samuel: The leaders in youth ministry played the largest role in understanding the gospel. I remember when the Lord saved me I went on Facebook and sent personal messages thanking the leaders who invested in my life.

PJ: When did you sense a call to youth ministry?

Samuel: God began working on my heart shortly after my conversion in the direction of full-time church ministry. I remember praying in my car and the Lord telling me to feed his sheep. My heart was broken for youth specifically and I wanted them to be free of the idols that plague so many youth and have peace and purpose that comes from God and not their peers.

PJ: *Tell us a little bit about your wife Jessica. When did you meet? When did you get married? How does she support you in your calling, and how do you support her in her calling?*

Samuel: Jessica and I met in high school, but she wouldn't talk to me because I was the boy always getting in trouble. It's a cool story because we dated in college and broke up after 5 months. Both of us professed to be Christians but we didn't live the gospel in our lives. During our time apart, we both fell in love with Jesus and met again one summer between college semesters. I knew that summer I was going to marry Jessica ... I just needed some money for a ring so that year I worked 3 jobs and took 18 credits. We got married on November 3, 2012 and I am thankful for everyday the Lord blesses me with Jessica. We like learning about the church and being involved because we have seen God work in both our hearts and change us to become more like him through our time spent working at churches.

PJ: *What is your greatest success in youth ministry?*

Samuel: It's hard to define great success in youth ministry because so much of the job is faithfulness, but if there is one thing I would consider success it has been my personal sanctification. God continues to humble me as a leader and show me how amazing Jesus is and how much Jesus loves his bride. The more I can become like Christ the more Jesus can use me.

PJ: *What is your greatest failure in youth ministry?*

Samuel: My greatest failure in ministry ... something that continues to be a work in progress for me ... is becoming performance-based to control and get certain results. I thought in the beginning of working in God's church that I had all the right ideas and could get them all done. Like Paul, God has given me thorns in my side to show me how weak I really am and how much I really need him.

PJ: *In your experience, what are some unique challenges young Christians face today?*

Samuel: I don't know if it has an actual name, but I'll steal the expression from my catholic friends and modify it. **Evangelical Guilt.** Young Christians have big hearts and want to challenge themselves with great godly questions, but never really connect the dots in biblical and practical ways. For example, a pastor might pray and preach that God's people would have a heart that breaks for the same things that God's heart breaks for. This could result in young Christians who help in a para-church organization or missions over seas, but it almost never results in young Christians becoming and serving in the local church.

PJ: *How does the gospel address those challenges?*

Samuel: Young Christians need to realize that Jesus loves and died for his church. God's heart was broken for his people (the church) and having a broken heart like God means serving the local church. The gospel gives believers a peace to serve God with clarity on what God wants us to do for his kingdom.

PJ: *How can we, as adult members, invest in the lives of our students?*

Samuel: By coming to youth fundraisers and supporting through giving which supports many youth trips, helping on Sunday nights during youth group to love and invest in student lives, and the last one is the most important; pray.

PJ: *How can we pray for our students?*

Samuel: Pray that when they fall into sin that they would come running to Jesus in repentance. Pray that they would know they are loved and forgiven in Christ and that they would make that their identity daily.

PJ: *How can we pray for you?*

Samuel: Pray that God would give me the strength to love those who are hard to love and serve those who are hard to serve. Pray that I wouldn't be afraid of failure and continue to grow into a Christian leader who cares about glorifying Jesus and not people-pleasing.

PJ: *Do you have any upcoming events you'd like to plug?*

Samuel: We have Ridge Haven coming up in February so please come to our fundraiser on February 4th. RYM Colorado is coming up so we would love your donations for our church garage sale. You can contact me for drop off.

PJ: *Thanks, Samuel! We appreciate your insight. We'll be praying for you, for the students, for your marriage ... and for God's grace to become more real to them (and you!) than anything else in the world!*

There you have it! Please remember to pray for Samuel and the students ... and consider ways that you can get involved in the lives of our students! I think you'll be glad you did.

The beginning of 2018 has been a busy time for Ian. He preached at the local church for three consecutive Sundays, recently conducted a Saturday night Bible teaching with people interested in theology but not wanting to obtain a degree, and his Thursday night Bible study has been going well. There have been some changes in the leadership at the hospital of PAAM LAAFI and as a result of those changes Ian has become more involved with that work.

This year the ministry is starting a new level of MINTS courses. These courses will be five nights a week and they are reaching a new group of people. The education level needed to attend these courses is lower than the previous courses. Ian will be teaching the first set of night courses on Old Testament Foundations. The following week a teacher will be here teaching a higher-level MINTS course. During the third week, Ian will be teaching a second week of night classes on New Testament Foundations. Then during the fourth and final week, Ian will travel to a neighboring country to teach a higher-level level course on the Doctrine of Christ.

A nearby community near where the ministry has been involved with CHE (community health education) has asked to learn how to make soap. The ministry has asked some of the ladies that have already been trained if they would be willing to teach the new group. Also, the ministry has some land in the village that they hope to start using for a church plant and also as a community center during the week.

Ian and Heather and their three children are doing well. Amy lost her first tooth!! A dirt road near their home is in the process of being paved, and consequently their water is cut off while the paving progresses. This has been going on for the past few weeks. Pray for patience for the family, and that the work would be finished soon. Heather and the children recently completed a two-week homeschool co-op. It was exhausting for them, but they had much fun and learned a lot. When the co-op was completed Jonathan returned to preschool and Daniel and Amy resumed their homeschool routine.

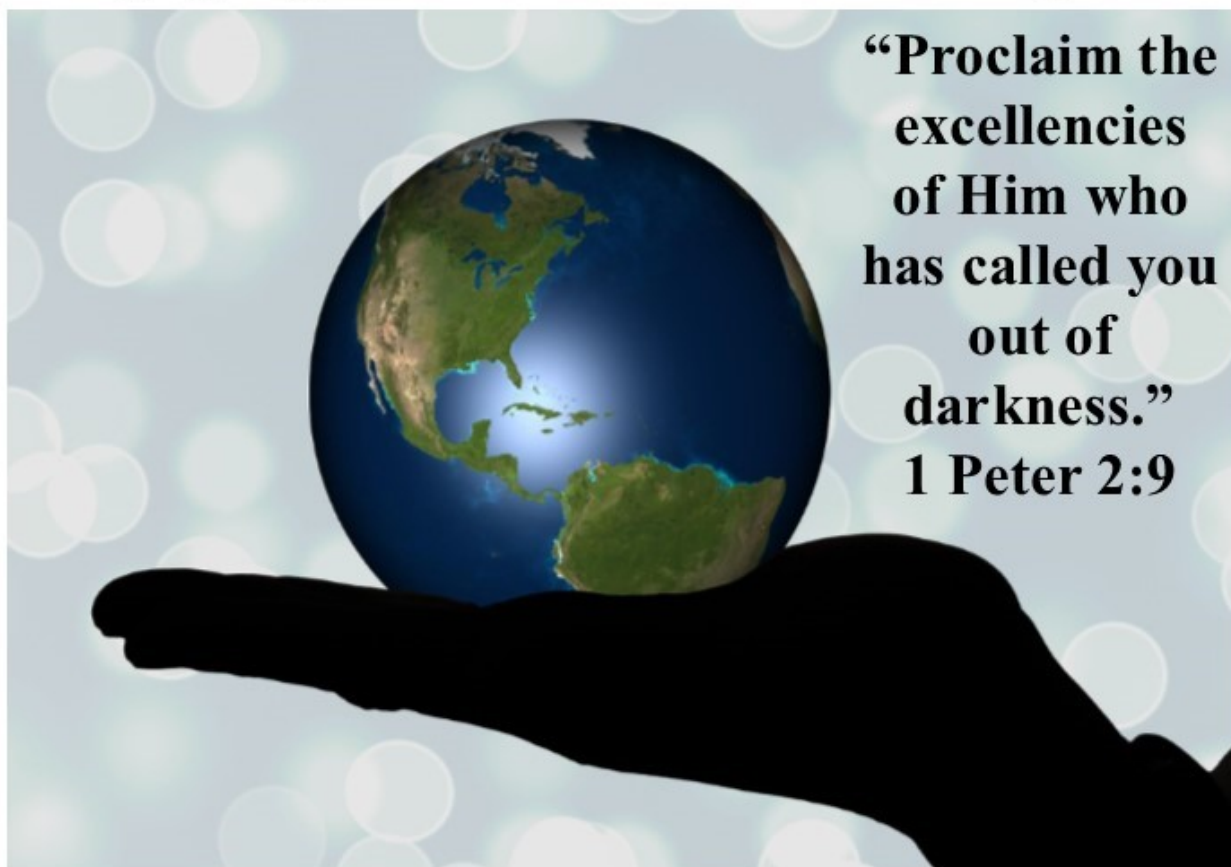

The Importance of Missions

The last command Jesus gave us was Matt: 28: 19-20. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you."

One of the best ways to fulfill this commandment is to be a missionary, but you can also fulfill it by supporting missions through your prayers and finances.

Brad & Margareta Winsted Children's Ministry International (CMI)



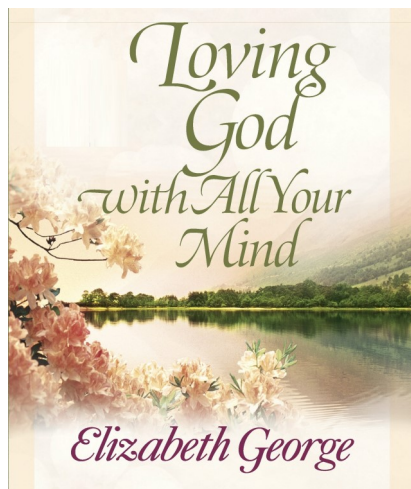

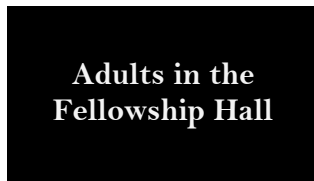
